#### Resolution Number 25-IMPO-005

A RESOLUTION amending the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP).

WHEREAS, the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) incorporates projects proposed by local governments and agencies within the Indianapolis Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, the projects contained in the proposed TIP amendments have been reviewed as to their immediate impact and importance to the continued improvement of the transportation system operating within the area; and

WHEREAS, changing conditions necessitate periodic amendments to the TIP; and

WHEREAS, the TIP is consistent with the 2050 MTP as amended; and

WHEREAS, the MPO consulted with the Interagency Consultation Group and the MPO anticipates, subsequent to Transportation Policy Committee approval, the USDOT will find that the proposed TIP amendments meet transportation conformity requirements under Section 176(C) of the Clean Air Act and 40 CFR Parts 51.390 and 93; and

WHEREAS, the proposed TIP Amendments were made available for public comment and comments received were provided to the Indianapolis Transportation Policy Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Policy Committee is the approval body for all transportation-related activities of the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the MPA under applicable U.S. Department of Transportation regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Indianapolis Transportation Policy Committee hereby approves the amendments to the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached Exhibit A.

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Good morning Kari,

I received additional information from INDOT concerning this project. When they refer to "ATL" they refer to added "Added Travel Lanes". The added travel lanes are not being extended from previous iterations of this project but costs have changed, as have sidewalks.

The Avon FY 21 US 36 ATL R-39814 Lead Des 1601072 (Hendricks County) extended east of Raceway Road for the third lane east bound to be merger back into the existing two-lane configuration. The west bound third lane started at this point as well, to begin the third lane before the Raceway Road intersection. The R-39814 Avon (Hendricks County) project did not have any sidewalks included in the project limits. Our FY 26 R-41781 US 36 ATL lead des 1800035 (Marion County) project is from I-465 & extends west to Raceway Road. We revised the scope over 5 years ago to extend our project limits for R-39814 to allow the sidewalks being built in the project to be extended to Raceway Road instead of stopping at the signal east of Raceway Road. The ATL Roadwork in that area was already done by contract R-39814. This

sidewalk extension for R-41781 was included in the Environment document & discussed at multiple public information meetings & the Public Hearing.

As far as the cost is concerned the project was underfunded when the contract was programmed in 2018. The Avon project Des 1601072 was a mile long project and was track as \$10 million. That means the Marion County contract Des 1800035 & 1800037 (not 1800036 as shown in table in the email below) should have been programed as \$14 million & 16 million & not at around \$7 million each since both were around a mile & a half in length. The District Capital Program Director & I talked to Central office about their estimate. They said that the software they used calculated the price for a rural roadway & couldn't price for an urban roadway. They agreed with our analysis based on the results we were seeing on the Avon project Des 1601072. Months later the market pricing drastically increased. We went through change management to request additional funding based on the Stage 2 estimate which was even higher due to the drastic price changes due to the increase of market prices.

In conclusion, there was no 0.8-mile extension of the ATL project. The roadway in the contract extension to Raceway Road for the sidewalk extension was already three lanes in each direction done previously by Des 1601072, The change in pricing for the entire contract was due to the project being underfunded for an urban ATL & the drastic increase in the market prices.

The Indianapolis MPO (IMPO) is proposing an amendment to the 2024-2027 Indianapolis Regional Transportation Improvement Program (IRTIP).

The projects in the attached listing have been preliminarily determined by IMPO and INDOT to be exempt projects. Two non-exempt amendments are included for INDOT projects, which are not sufficient enough to impact the previous conformity finding. They are as follows:

- INDOT (Johnson Co) -- 1800033 SR 135 (Meridian St.) Widening from Stones Crossing to Whiteland Rd.
  - This non-exempt project is changing estimated letting from 2027 to 2030. There are no changes to project cost.
- INDOT (Hendricks Co) -- 1800035 US 36 Added Travel Lanes, Raceway Rd. to Transfer Dr.
  - This non-exempt project amendment increases cost from \$22,615,967 to \$58,373,664

This amendment will have a 10-day public review and comment period from April 5-15, 2025 and will be presented for public hearing approval by the IMPO's Transportation Policy Committee on April 16, 2025. A further schedule is listed below.
